

Healthy Schools

Priority One

Extended Services-development of outreach and counselling for families:

- Several families have been referred to Newquay Parent Support Advisors. E.g Working with guardian for behaviour support which has impacted on school behaviours. Securing taxi transport so able to attend school regularly as guardian has ill health
- Pyramid Club for identified pupils with low self esteem. - Summer term 2010 Data and comments from parents and pupils show positive impact
- SENCO and Outreach support for individual children have identified appropriate agencies for support e.g child who was excluded has shown significant behaviour improvement.
- Family learning in summer 2010 enabled two parents from the group to achieve level one in literacy

Priority Two

Identified areas from survey of parents: enjoyment of playtimes and pupils talking about their concerns:

- New huff and puff equipment purchased and timetabled.
- New surface for KS1 play equipment area
- Year 6 pupils supporting reception class
- Extra TA for playing games 4 lunchtimes per week
- School grounds enhanced July 2010 - reading/drama area and herb garden
- Self esteem questionnaire purchased for 2010-2011
- "R" Time introduced in September 2010 and impacting on class relationships
- SHEU survey completed in June 2010 and evidence used by Healthy Schools Committee
- Chat Club continuing at playtime
- Outreach worker has dedicated time to support pupils and all pupils who require support with social skills have "Socially Speaking" support weekly.

Priority Three

Vulnerable pupils - raise self-esteem and motivation through activities such as gardening/cooking activities

- Gardening Club in place
- Let's Get Cooking
- Group attended "Bishops Forum"
- One pupil accessed funding to attend "Forest School"
