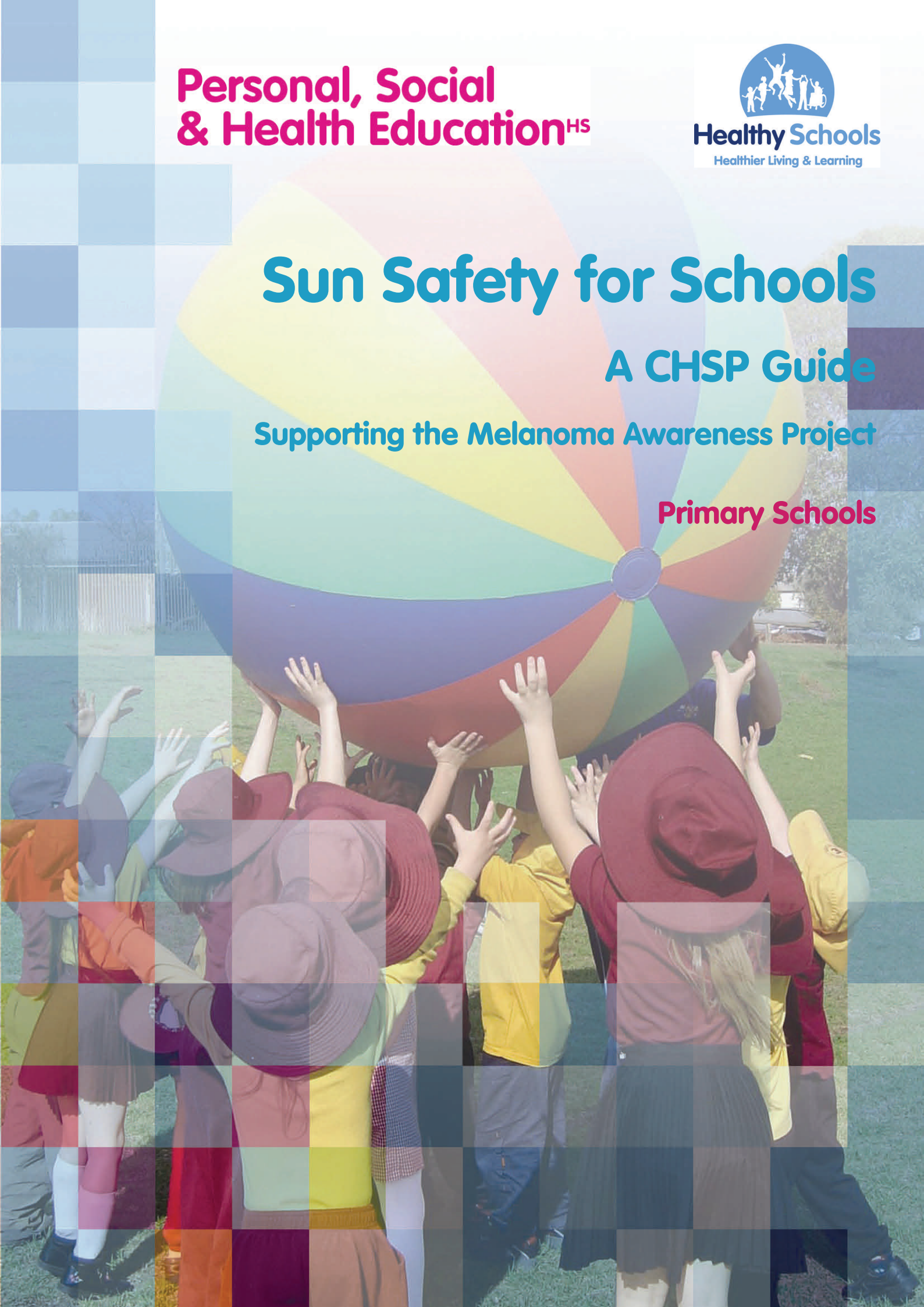

Does it cover:

Education / information for staff, pupils and parents

Protection e.g. clothing (uniform, sports kit, hats
shade in the Playground / Grounds
use of sunscreen

Timetabling (outdoor activities to avoid 11—3pm where possible

School Trips

Does it involve children and young people in its development and dissemination?
